What is a Compliment **?**

- 1. Saying something NICE **about** someone
- 2. Saying something NICE directly ${f to}$ the person

When you say something nice <u>about</u> a person, <u>to</u> that person, he or she will probably feel good. This is why we say, *giving* a compliment is like *giving* a gift.



Gifts and Compliments provide value and make people feel good.
