What is a Compliment ?

- 1. Saying something NICE about someone
- 2. Saying something **NICE** to someone

When you say something nice <u>about</u> a person, <u>to</u> that person, he or she will probably feel good. This is why we say, **giving** a compliment is like **giving** a gift.





Gifts and **Compliments** provide **value** and make people **feel good**.
